RE: Serious Concerns Regarding Recent Police Interactions - [REDACTED] by [REDACTED]

I am writing to raise significant concerns about recent interactions between North Yorkshire Police and the [REDACTED], which appear to demonstrate a concerning pattern of unwarranted and potentially harmful official actions.

Specifically, I wish to highlight two incidents:

## 1. Recent Child Welfare Check

On Monday 17<sup>th</sup> November, a probationary officer conducted an unexpected and intrusive child welfare check at the [REDACTED] on [REDACTED]. Key issues include:

- The check was performed without clear legal justification
- No evidence of domestic abuse, child neglect, or welfare concerns was present
- The officer collected extensive personal information about the children, including names, dates of birth, and school details
- The family was subsequently reported to social services without substantive grounds

The officer claimed this was "standard procedure," which the family has independently verified is incorrect. This action has caused significant emotional distress and potential reputational damage to a law-abiding family.

## 2. Previous Firearm Damage Incident

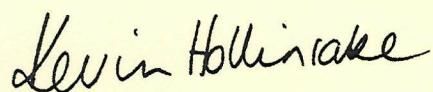
We also seek clarity and compensation regarding an earlier incident involving damage to the family's firearm during a previous police interaction.

We request:

- A full internal review of these interactions
- Confirmation of the legal basis for the child welfare check
- Clarification on the social services referral
- Details of compensation for firearm damage
- Assurance of appropriate officer training to prevent future such incidents

[REDACTED] feels they are being unfairly targeted and are seeking resolution and accountability.

I look forward to your prompt response and investigation.
